Zackery Tucker, First Vice President

Board adopts new Professional and Ethical Standards of Conduct




Early in Spring 2023, the Board of Directors asked Zackery Tucker, 1st Vice President & Dean of Students at ASU-Beebe, to draft a more comprehensive standard of conduct document for the association. At the Fall Conference, September 7-9, 2023, Tucker presented a draft document in a professional development session, which was based on modifications of the National Debate Tournament's, a unit of the American Forensic Association, Conduct Policy (Rule 1.C Standing Rules for the Operation of the National Debate Tournament, December 2022).

Following feedback from members at the Fall Conference, a final proposal was submitted to the Board of Directors at their Winter Meeting on December 16, 2023. At the Winter Meeting, the Board approved an electronic vote to be held on the document 30 days following the meeting. The Board adopted the proposed document, and a unanimous vote was certified on February 12, 2024, by ACTAA President Brandon Box-Higdem.

The newly adopted Professional & Ethical Standards of Conduct for the association has been incorporated into the ACTAA Organizational Handbook linked <u>here</u>.

ACTAA recognizes that the adversarial and competitive nature of academic competition (whether debate, forensics, acting, etc.) may place participants in the position of weighing



the merits of competing strategies that may have ethical implications. At the same time, ACTAA is an association of professional educators committed to promoting a respectful form of expression, communication, and argumentation. In adopting this policy, ACTAA recognizes the need to clearly communicate civility, ethical behavior, inclusion, and respect expectations in a competitive environment. Additionally, ACTAA acknowledges the need for an equitable and consistent process for hearing grievances in the association to avoid any long-term adversarial relationships.

Members should be aware of this new policy of the association and know all students, coaches, judges, staff, and all other individuals present at or participating in an activity sanctioned by ACTAA, in any capacity whatsoever, are expected to know and are required to abide by these new Professional & Ethical Standards of Conduct.

BUSINESS UPDATES

Special Committee on Tournament Research to be Formed Late-Spring

On Saturday, February 10, the Board of Directors met in person in Russellville to hear several proposals from Eric Gamble related to the Arkansas State Forensics and Debate Championship (ASC) and smaller schools equity in the Arkansas circuit.

At the meeting, the Board moved for the President to appoint a Special Committee to research and thoroughly review the cumulative results reports related to ASC, ASC qualifying invitational tournaments and the Arkansas Student Congress from Fall 2018 to Spring 2024, and report findings related to smaller school (1A-5A) equity compared to larger schools (6A-7A).

A college member will chair the special committee, which consists of one member from each AAA designation (1A-7A). If no representative is identified, that AAA division-designated position will remain vacant.

The committee is planned to be formed post-ASC, April 12-13, with expectations to report findings to the Board of Directors at the Summer Workshop, July 21-23.

I hope your semester is starting well! As I have been thinking about what to write about for our newsletter, a couple of things came to mind.

Always keep an open mind, you never know when your efforts for one area will pay off in another way. For example, I used our Best in Show script, Blithe Spirit, as a class project in my Advanced Tech class. I had each student choose a tech element to then design. They could choose from scenic, costume, props, sound, lighting, or publicity. Little did I know that that project, coupled with

their design of last November's children's play, would land the students into a great frame of mind when heading into the team design challenges at the State Thespian Festival. Teams from my school landed in the top three for both costume and scenic design.

If I don't ask for help, the answer I will get is ALWAYS no!

This is a motto that I have adopted since starting a theatre program at a brand new school. A PD I once attended said that help for a program either equates to time or money. So, I ask for specifics.

- "I need X amount of money to do what is going to help serve our students in the best way. Can you help me reach it?"
- "I need someone to man my ticket table. Hey colleague, can you come work the table before our shows?"
- "Parent, we will have long rehearsal nights in tech week, can you organize the meals for our cast and crew?"
- "We need more blood capsules for our production, could you run and get them from this retailer?"
- "If you have time, could you stop and get me a coffee? I really need caffeine!" (I have done this for my colleagues and they have done it for me. Nothing feels as good as to have someone care enough to follow through on their offer of help.)
- "Can we have school-wide spirit days to promote our musical?"
- "I see that the district is planning XYZ is there any way that my troupe or team can help?" These are just a few specific questions, there are tons more. I find it amazing how much my own brain limited what I asked for because I didn't want to be a bother, but if it is to make our programs better, WE HAVE TO ASK because when we don't, the answer is always no. So as we go into the final months of the school year, we should ask ourselves the following
- questions:
- To what questions do I always assume the answer will be no?
- Where do I need to be bolder for our students?
- What does our program need the most?
- What is keeping me from asking?
- What's the worst that can happen if I do ask?
 As you mull over those questions, your ASK should become apparent.
